Athlete Services

The Centre's athletes' service curriculum is divided into three streams: *Performance Services*, *Life Services* and *Support Services*, all ensure holistic development in Saskatchewan high performance athletes.

Performance Services

Through the partnership with the **Sport Medicine and Science Council of Saskatchewan (SMSCS)**, the CSCS provides a comprehensive menu of services to Saskatchewan's high performance athletes and training groups including: sport medicine, exercise physiology, sport nutrition, mental training, biomechanical analysis, and medical coverage. The SMSCS has an extensive service provider group with over 50 consultant members who meet the professional educational standards established by the CSCS.

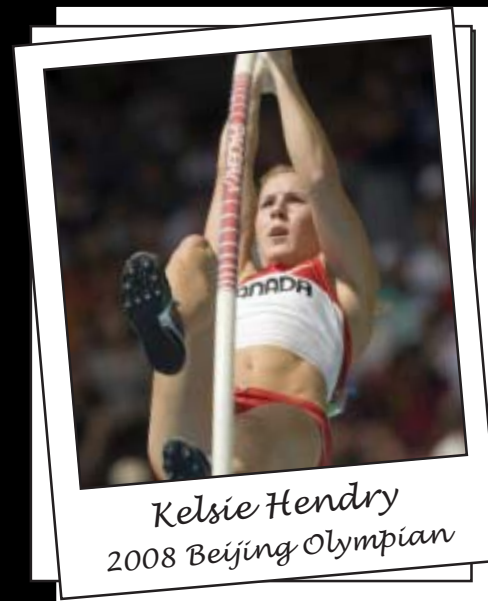
SMSCS delegates attended the SPIN Conference and National Sport Science meetings. Additionally, they are involved in delivering professional workshops to athletes and coaches.

Athletes can enjoy the benefits of the **GymFit Program** with access to resistance training, recovery, and cardiovascular training equipment. GymFit partners located throughout Saskatchewan include: Quantum Fitness, CBI, Saskatoon YWCA, University of Saskatchewan Physical Activity Centre, Craven Sport Services, YWCA Regina, Level 10 Fitness, Athlete Development, University of Regina and the Moose Jaw YMCA.

Through **Support Services** athletes have access to a variety of support such as product sponsorships with Wyeth Consumer Healthcare Inc. and CV Technologies Inc. for healthcare products including Centrum, Advil, Chapstick, Caltrate and Cold FX. **Sport Solution** is a service offered by Athletes CAN to provide legal support and **Sport Tax** offers assistance in personal tax return preparation from a qualified professional. Additional resources are provided to athletes for self marketing tools such as promotional materials, business cards, website design, etc.

The **Life Services** program includes services such as **SportHelp**, which provides confidential personal counselling. Athletes also participated in educational workshops such as sport nutrition, and Women in Sport luncheons featuring Olympic track and field coach Carla Nicholls. Kelsie Hendry was successful in being named an RBC Olympian through the **Athlete Job Opportunities** program.

Future Best provides financial assistance to athletes who have the potential to become a national senior team member, but have not reached carding status or been named to the team. This year 89 athletes received support from this program which is supplemented by the Canada Games Building Dreams and Champions Legacy Program.

Training Group Partnerships

One of the priorities for the CSCS is to establish high performance training program partnerships at national and international development levels. Regional training groups include: curling, wrestling, gymnastics (men), fencing, wheelchair athletics, and athletics (pole vault). Developmental training groups include basketball, soccer, and small bore.

Coaching Services

Coach Visitation Program grants were awarded to four Provincial Sport Governing Bodies in 2008/09. David Kenwright, a top women's artistic gymnastics coach presented at a Gymnastic Saskatchewan Coaches Forum on Nov. 7 in Saskatoon. Synchro Saskatchewan conducted a high performance excellence camp and a provincial coaches professional development course in Saskatoon on Dec. 13 and 14 with Lesley Sproule, Alberta's high performance and international synchro clinician. Mike MacKay and Allison McNeill of Canada Basketball provided a session to Basketball Saskatchewan coaches during the CIS Women's Basketball Championships in Regina on Mar. 5-8. The Saskatchewan Baton Twirling Association brought in coaches Dale White of the United States, Gregory Tinet, formerly of France, and Chiharu Tachibana, Japan, to instruct at the Escalate to Excellence Coaches Forum.

Natalie Good, synchro, and Melanie Sanford, volleyball, received *Women in Coaching Professional Development Grants*. This female coach professional development program was offered for the first time in 2008/09. Sanford was supported to complete her NCCP Level V requirements, and Good was supported to attend the Western Divisional Synchro Championships in British Columbia.

Russell Martin, softball, received a *High Performance Coach Professional Development Grant*, to attend the Be The Best You Can Be softball clinic in New Jersey. This clinic was instructed by some of the best college and national team coaches in North America.

A number of Lunch and Learn and Coach Professional Development Days were held this year. There were presentations held on team building, sport injury and prevention, sport medicine and science performance planning, benefits and risks of eccentric training, recovery, and working with lesbian/gay athletes and coaches.

National Coaching Institute – Saskatchewan

Dr. Don Clark was appointed director of the National Coaching Institute – Saskatchewan. Dr. Clark participated in national NCI meetings regarding the development of the Competition Development Advanced Graduation (Coach Diploma) and Competition High Performance contexts. The NCI-SK consulted with national and provincial sport organizations regarding master coaches, and recruited subject matter experts to

serve as Learning Facilitators and Level IV and V Task Presenters. Other initiatives undertaken by NCI-SK this year included: discussions with post-secondary institutions regarding NCCP components as part of certificate or degree programs; coordinating applications for Women in Coaching NCI Scholarships; providing support for Women in Coaching Professional Development Initiatives; supporting the CAC Coaching Internship Program, hosting the ePortfolio Workshop for NCI coaches; offering NCCP Level IV and V tasks to allow Saskatchewan coaches to complete the Levels program prior to the transition to the Stream-Context program; and established contacts for distance education through the Saskatchewan Regional College network.

Communications Services

This was an active year as the CSCS strived to increase the profile and public recognition of Saskatchewan's high performance athletes and coaches as well as CSCS programs and services.

A new website domain name was registered for the CSCS at www.csc-sask.sk.ca, which features a revised look and more user-friendly interface. CSCS ENews was developed and emailed on a regular basis and archived on the website, providing up-to-date information, results and achievements of our Saskatchewan athletes.

CSCS promoted Saskatchewan and Canadian hopefuls for the 2008 Olympic and Paralympic Games in Beijing, China.

Promotions included providing athlete information and profiles to the media, government and the general public, a Striving to Reach Beijing campaign, and current news on the CSCS website as athletes became Team Canada members. Visits to the website leading up to and during the Beijing Games went to over 1,000 visits in September.

Promotion is well underway for the 2010 Winter Olympics and Paralympics in Vancouver. The CSCS has been in regular communication with the Vancouver Organizing Committee (VANOC), the Canadian Olympic Committee (COC) and the Canadian Paralympic Committee (CPC) to coordinate the promotion of Saskatchewan athletes at these Games.

CSCS website continues to improve as we now profile all CSCS registered athletes and their results and achievements as provided.

The CSCS played a role in the organization and promotion of the event, including providing ambassadors, sponsoring the guest speaker Joan McCusker (1998 Olympic medalist). This marked the fifth year of the Ambassador program and 16 CSCS athletes hosted corporate tables.

Fund Development

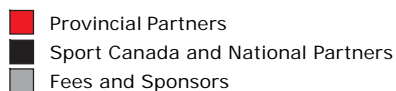
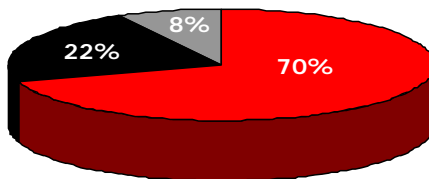
Hbc continues to be a major sponsor through their annual donation of \$50,000 to support various training initiatives.

Future Best and the Coach Employment Program are two of the major benefactors of the funding received through the 2005 Canada Games Building Dreams and Champions Legacy Program.

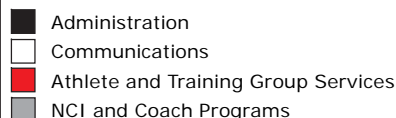
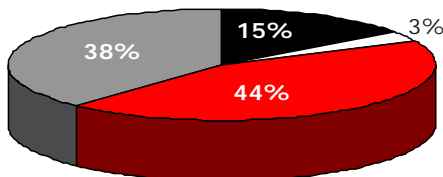
